Main Street Maine Communities

- The Main Street Approach® was developed by the National Main Street Center of the National Trust for Historic Preservation. The 1700 local Main Street® programs in over 40 states who have adopted this preservation-based approach have realized \$17.0 billion dollars in reinvestment in their downtown commercial districts.
- This program encourages economic development, within the context of historic preservation that is appropriate to today's market place. This approach advocates a return to community self-reliance, empowerment, and the rebuilding of commercial districts based on its traditional assets: unique architecture, personal service, local ownership, and a sense of community.
- The Four Point Approach includes organization, promotion, design, and economic restructuring.
- Nine communities are currently designated in Maine. Rockland and Sanford may also be designated in 2009.
